Greetings Area,

This needs to be done by Friday July 15th at 12PM. Next, I have tried to make contact with Brian to see if he has the willingness to assist in cooking the hog this year. I have not been successful in making contact. This may be an issue as I do not know who else knows how to cook the hog. Mike D from Council Bluffs is booked to DJ the Luau for \$150. Kim and I gathered 4 complete bids for SWINA apparel. These bids will be attached and passed out to be voted on in Area so the hoodie and jacket order form can be distributed as soon as possible. I have booked the DJ for SWINA. Jessie M. from Cedar Rapids is willing to DJ for 2 free SWINA shirts. Due to being fully self-supporting I suggest we get him the 2 shirts, pay for his camping (as he did say he was going to come camp), the Saturday evening meal for him and his Co-DJ and a \$80 gas card for reimbursement. At the last subcommittees we discussed workshops. These workshops however were not voted on in Area. I have attached a proposed schedule that I will be asking area to approve for titles. Activities will be having a Zoom meeting Sunday June 26th at 6PM. Please come join us, we have lots to discuss and accomplish! Bids for the Halloween function are due in July! Nothing was brought in May for an August basic function so lets get some functions going!!!

BID #1

With that said, thank you for reaching out. I would be happy to help in this process. I am going to throw a wrench into this though. One thing that we do for many organizations is set up an online store fundraiser. To put it simply, we setup a website for you. We put the products in that store that you would like to sell and we can add a fundraising amount (whatever amount you would like) to each item. Customers then go to the site and order whatever they like and pay directly through the site. Once that is complete, we cut a check to you for the fundraising amount and we produce the products. We usually have an option for people to have items shipped directly to them, and then we have a pickup option. You can choose to have everyone pick up their orders from our store, or we can individually bag each order with a packing slip (for easy dispersal) and give them all to you to disperse. We find this is a great option for fundraising as it minimizes your risk, you don't have to guess sizes and quantities, you don't end up with unsold merchandise, you don't have to try to sell items, etc. Now with an online store, there is a minimum of 24 items for screen print designs. That means if you opened an online store and only 14 products sold with your design, you would be responsible for placing an order for 10 items to bring the store up to the minimum. I don't anticipate that would be an issue, I just believe in putting that out there and setting a realistic expectation.

We price those items at the 12-35 piece pricing tier unless the store organizer wants to guarantee a higher minimum. If you wanted to have a 36 piece minimum, we would set the pricing at the 36-71 piece pricing tier. Hopefully that makes sense.

I am not sure what kind of jacket you're looking for, so I will do a zip up hoodie and a full zip without hood option.

With that all said, you can certainly place a bulk order. That is completely fine as well. I will provide some information on our pricing below. Just know that this pricing is based on the TOTAL number of items made with the same design. For example if you ordered 10 tees, 12 hoodies, and 14 jackets, and they all get the same design, that would be 36 items total. That means each item would be at the 36 piece price. Pricing is for up to size XL.. 2XL is an additional \$2. Each additional X is another \$2. Pricing based on 1 color front and 4 color back. Pricing is good for 30 days.

As you mentioned the color “gray” for the apparel, for this job, we would recommend either Sport Grey or Ash so your artwork would show up without adding a white base, which adds an additional charge for the additional color.

For the pricing, the “quantity” **INCLUDES** all three styles to obtain the final quantity. We do have a minimum order/reorder of 24 pieces. Pricing is based upon quantity of each order.

We are having some supply chain issues, but in looking at the items above in the Sport Grey and Ash colors, they do CURRENTLY have great stock except in the Ash colored Full Zip Hoodie in size XL - they show a July restock date for this item.
